APC PROGRAMME 2021



The Assessment of Professional Competence (APC) is the second of SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ's two Qualifying Examinations. The APC is currently written in December of each year and is the final Examination required for Candidates to qualify as a CA.

In order to be able to write the APC Examination, you are required to have completed 20 months of traineeship, pass the ITC and complete and pass a Professional Programme accredited by SAICA/ICAN/ICAZ.

Our Programme meets the SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ Requirements at Level 1 ("Accredited without conditions").

APT is Southern Africa's leading presenter of preparation courses for the SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ APC Examinations, having prepared the vast majority of Candidates since inception.

APT is a Professional Organisation and our balanced team consists of academics and practitioners from the profession, commerce and industry.

Highlights

One of our great strengths is our flexibility and adaptability to meet the candidates' needs. A recent example is our response to the COVID pandemic and resulting lockdown. Nature of the APC?

- Our Programme is designed to enable you to develop a level of Professional Competence in order to pass the SAICA. ICAN, ICAZ APC.
- The first SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ Qualifying Examination, the ITC (Part 1), focuses on the
 assessment of technical competence and is a standard setting examination after Candidates
 complete a university programme (CTA or equivalent).
- The APC is the second and final formal assessment before a Candidate may register as a CA.
 The APC is an assessment of professional competence and focuses on the integration of technical skills within 'real life' circumstances, on pervasive skills such as communication, on understanding the 'big picture' (the business and the environment in which the business operates) and on strategy, risk management and governance.
- Whilst aspects of professional competence are developed in the university programmes and in training programmes, our Programme focusses fully on developing your competence to the level required of a CA.
- The APC assesses professional competence to the full extent possible in a written examination and has been very carefully designed to do so.

Our APC Programme

Our 2021 Programme will commence on 16 April and will terminate shortly before the APC on 1 December 2021.

Our Professional Competence Programme is of six months duration and meets all requirements set by SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ.

It is designed to achieve the learning objectives set out in relevant SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ APC Guidelines, specifically with regard to the development of professional competence.

We work closely with CAA Zim and ICAZ in Harare and Bulawayo and ICAN in Windhoek.

Our Programme incorporates four formal Assessments.

The first two are principally formative (Developmental, although Candidates need to achieve a minimum grade) and the final two summative (Assessments that Candidates need to Pass in order to Pass the Programme). Each of these Assessments simulates a "real" APC Assessment.

Candidates who Pass the first formative assessment are exempted from the second, although they are encouraged to write the second for additional practice. Similarly, Candidates who pass the first summative assessment are exempted from the second.

Our Programme has a Professional focus rather than an Academic or Technical one. Candidates will already have demonstrated Technical Competence in the ITC.

The primary objective of our Professional Competence Programme is to develop the professional competence of Candidates to a level appropriate for new entrants to the Chartered Accountancy profession.

A secondary, but very important, objective of our Programme

is to prepare you for the APC. Professional competence is developed through a series of 7 Case Study simulations of a real life assignments and tasks.

You develop your professional competence through practice by working through these Case Studies. Each of our Case Studies is a simulation of a "real" APC Assessment.



Our APC Programme

We are a Fully Online Programme.

Through Blended Learning, we support our Online classes with physical, face-to-face contact sessions related to critical classes. These are held in all major centres.

As the acquisition of professional competence is so fundamentally different from the skills most Candidates have already developed in their academic programmes, we believe that Candidates benefit significantly from the Blended Learning Programme's direct interaction with presenters. Mentorship is provided on an appointment basis.

Our Online Classes are supported by interactive live Zoom Question and Answer Sessions after each class and further support is provided by additional interactive Zoom sessions, including Candidate Information Sessions, Guided Self-Assessment Sessions and Small Group Consultations. Recordings are made available for Candidates who are unable to attend these live sessions.

Whilst all of our 2020 Assessments were Non-Venue-Based because of Lockdown, we propose to run our two summative 2021 Assessments in formal Exam Venues so that our Candidates experience a realistic simulation of the actual APC.

Our Programme also offers Value Added through our CPD Module, which provides technical updates in selected topics and enables Candidates to determine their personal development needs and address those needs. Certain CPD topics are compulsory and you are required to log this CPD.

We are innovators who constantly leverage technology. Our recent innovations include:

- Our Marking App, which provides Candidates with details of Assessment Gradings.
- Artificial Intelligence Applications that enable us to run Non-Venue-Based Assessments for our Assessments.
- Our HelpDesk App that enables us to assist Candidates with Exam Software issues.

eWriting

Candidates write the APC on laptops using Exam Software prescribed by SAICA, ICAN and ICAZ ("eWriting"). In common with our competitors, we require our Candidates to use the same software. The discriminator, however, is that we provide extensive guidance and support to ensure that our Candidates are fully ready for this by the time they write the APC.

Candidates who have written the ITC and will have completed 20 month's traineeship by 30 November 2021 should register for the 2021 Programme. **As there will be no sitting of the ITC in June, we will not be offering a Catchup Programme in 2021.** Find more information <u>here</u>.


